Chairman's Message

2006 was a breakout year for The Actuarial Foundation, particularly within our **Youth Education** efforts. In 2005, the Board of Trustees decided that — to supplement and enhance the success of our *Advancing Student Achievement* classroom mentoring programs we needed to find a way to reach more teachers and their students than can ever be done through mentoring programs alone. To bring this concept to reality, we established a partnership with Scholastic, an organization that has a proven track record in getting educational material into the hands of thousands of teachers across America. Our initial effort, *Shake, Rattle, & Roll*, used the mathematics of natural disasters as a way to interest kids in math concepts, and it was distributed to more than 40,000

teachers last fall. Look for it on our Web site; you might want to show it to teachers in your own community!

This kind of effort costs money, and you — our individual and corporate donors — provided The Actuarial Foundation with the resources to make this partnership work. In 2006, we received more contributions from more people than ever before. In addition, the U.S.-based actuarial organizations continue to provide us with a substantial base of funding that covers our infrastructure costs and enables us to apply other contributions directly to our programs.

At the same time our other programs areas continue to thrive. Our **Consumer Education** programs, in partnerships with organizations such as FLASH (the Federal Alliance for Safe Homes), Department of Labor, and WISER (Women's Institute for a Secure Retirement), provide consumers with factual information that

they can use in making financial decisions. Our **Research & Actuarial Education** programs continue to provide actuarial researchers with financial grants to expand the base of actuarial knowledge, and our scholarship programs encourage tomorrow's actuaries. (In 2006, we received new funding to establish a scholarship program in memory of Stuart Robertson, one of the founders of the Milliman firm.)

Please take a couple of minutes to review this report. If you are already a supporter of The Actuarial Foundation, it should make you proud; if you are not, it should encourage you to join our ranks and help us to remain positioned for tomorrow's possibilities.

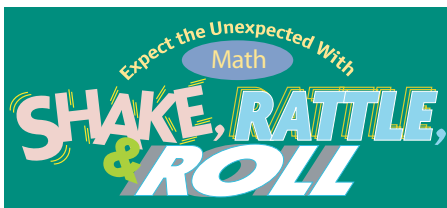

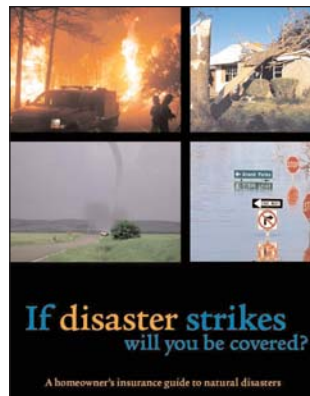

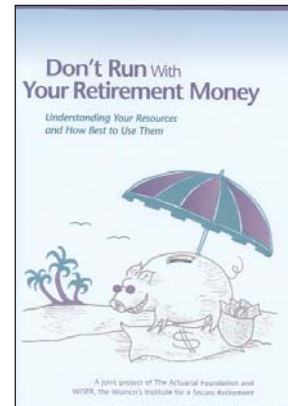

Consumer Education materials continue to be highly sought after by the general public.



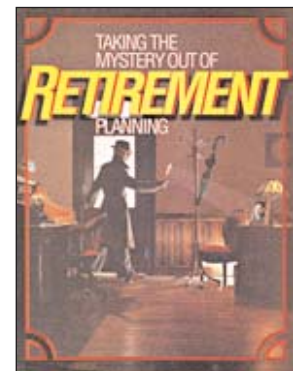
If disaster strikes will you be covered?

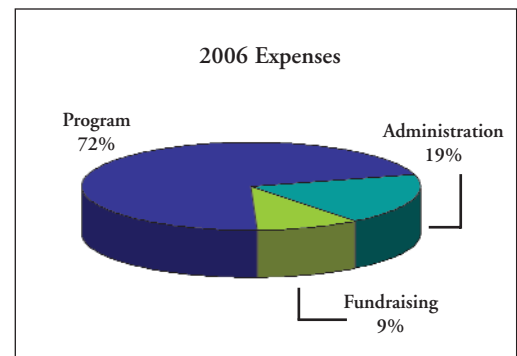
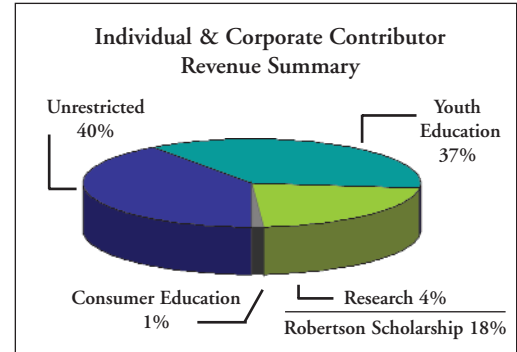
